#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL Forty Hours Devotion

The custom of the Forty Hours Devotion comes from the number of hours Jesus was thought to have spent in the tomb - from late Friday afternoon until Sunday morning. The devotion arose in the 16th century and was celebrated once a year in many parishes.

Forty is a sacred number in Scripture. In the time of Noah, the rain lasted for forty days and nights; the Jewish people wandered in the desert for forty days, while being tempted by Satan, before beginning his public ministry.

Originally, this devotion seems to have been a time of supplication (begging) and reparation (making amends for a wrong). Later, the focus centered on adoring the Blessed Sacrament and spending time with Jesus face-to-face.
